This 5th iteration of the Normandy World Peace Forum, is taking place against a backdrop of particularly disturbing international events, marked mainly by the terrible conflict currently taking place in Ukraine. The consequences of this war, combined with those of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, pose major risks of destabilisation for the rest of the world, particularly in terms of food and economics.

In this difficult context and in the continuity of the considerable work of remembrance carried out in our region since 1945, Normandy is once again reaffirming its attachment to the values of peace and freedom of which it has been the ambassador for nearly 80 years. More than ever, through this Forum, the Region hopes to make a concrete commitment by offering the keys to today's generations, and more particularly to young people, to enable each person to become a builder of peace at their own level.

This is why this year, for the first time since the creation of the Forum in 2018, the event will be held on a Saturday to allow as many people as possible to participate. Hence, on Saturday 24 September, in addition to the conferences and debates that are at the heart of the Forum, the Village for Peace will offer activities dedicated to families, such as live shows, exhibitions, fun workshops and testimonies.

While the success of the Forum has never wavered, with an ever-growing audience of curious people and experts, this 2022 iteration will once again aim to bring together all those who share the desire to build a fairer world and to commit themselves to peace and freedom.

WALLS, OBSTACLES TO PEACE



 \rightarrow In the 20th century, walls were symbolic of the confrontation between the two blocs. After the fall of the Berlin Wall and the advent of a world of free trade and free movement, they did not disappear.

On the contrary, others appeared with the same security justifications and the same symbolic significance. Since the wall between Israel and the Palestinian Territories, the so-called "migration crises" have been used to justify walls all over the world, from the United States and Mexico, to India and Bangladesh, to Hungary and Romania. Of course, walls are not just physical. Inequalities further divide populations and foster extreme ideologies that lead to fanaticism.

After several years of uncertainty, the outbreak of the war in Ukraine has revived the fear of war on the European continent. Debates on security in Europe are being revived. The European Union must reassess its relations with its environment. In the East, Vladimir Putin's Russia is using Belarus as a base for its invasion of Ukraine. In the South, Europe has lost ground to other powers seeking to gain influence on the African continent. Europe must also be alert to threats within its own borders. The rise of nationalism is accompanied by a resurgence of border walls that jeopardise Europe's ideal of openness.


