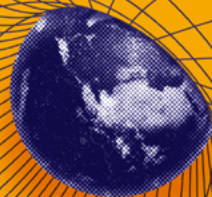

More than ever, through this Forum, the Region is making a concrete commitment to honour the memory of those whose bravery and sacrifices liberated Normandy, France and Europe. In keeping with this legacy, the Normandy World Peace Forum aims to bring together the generations of today and tomorrow, who wish to become builders of peace, spreading the hope of a fairer and safer world.

UNDERSTANDING VIOLENCE OF THE WORLD'S SHIFT

10 AM - 12 PM

➔ In the past, peace was threatened almost exclusively by State violence, the violence of neighbours and rivals, carried out by so-called 'regular' armies.

Today, the situation is very different: the violence affecting the international scene takes a variety of forms. No matter whether it is linked to economic interests, social protest or ethnic or religious differences, it is often exacerbated by feelings of humiliation, age-old resentments and global changes that engender incomprehension and fear. Is the world on the verge of a tipping point?

A sense of impotence prevails across Europe, Africa and the Near and Middle East regarding these global changes. By understanding these new forms of violence and pinpointing the links between them, we can anticipate and control them more effectively. We can only move beyond the status quo and build the peace of tomorrow if we take the time to analyse this unprecedented landscape and assess its political implications.

→ **The attack on 7th October 2023 plunged the Middle East back into violence.** We have since seen missile attacks from Iran, an escalation with Hezbollah, Houthi attacks in the Red Sea, violence by Israeli settlers in the West Bank and situations continuing to cause concern in Lebanon, Syria, Iraq and elsewhere. All this raises difficult but valid questions: Is peace lost? Who could take the initiative here? The United States? Europe? Other States in the Global South? Never has a peace initiative seemed so essential, yet so unlikely.

→ **The world is heading into a new era in which the emergence of new forms of violence reflects profound changes in the balance of power.** The growing diversity of the protagonists involved demands a fresh approach to conflict resolution. New transgressions that defy old diplomatic approaches and the classic game of negotiation mean that we need to find a formula for managing these new parameters, while at the same time involving the traditional peacemakers – multilateral institutions, diplomats and NGOs.

These questions are essential to reclaiming control of international relations. They necessitate a global approach that transcends regional or sectoral perspectives. A commitment to genuine cooperation rather than mere competition is more crucial than ever when it comes to resolving ongoing conflicts. This calls for a more equitable sharing of power, resources and worldviews.
